Gap Antenna Review by Ron Wenig, NY3J

I am now convinced that your antenna is the most important part of your ham station. For a long time I was frustrated with the receive capabilities of my radio. The station I was trying to receive was buried in lots of noise. It seemed stations could receive my transmissions ok so I ruled out the antenna. I thought for sure it was my Kenwood TS440S. Maybe it needed to be reworked or maybe I just needed to trade it in on a new rig. I finally decided on upgrading the antenna system here at the house. I saw good reviews on the Gap antenna so I decided to give it a try. After installing it I couldn't believe how much my radio came alive. Instead of just amplifying noise I was able to hear intelligent signals. Here's my review of the antenna.

The model is the Titan DX made by Gap. The Titan is a center fed vertical and doesn't require the long radial wires that some verticals use. It does require a counterpoise which consists of 4 rigid aluminum tubes that extend 80 inches out from the antenna. These rods are connected at the end with wire so if it is ground mounted this area would be enclosed. I'm going to try to mount the antenna on a longer pipe so this area won't be blocked and to make cutting the grass easier. Mounting it on the ground was a plus for me because I wanted to keep it off of roof. It keeps a low profile in the neighborhood and eliminates any interference with the house.

Another reason I purchased this antenna was its coverage. It's range is the entire 10 to 80 meters including all of the WARC bands without a tuner. I pick a spot and can start transmitting without having to worry about the SWR. On the 80 meter band it will only cover a 100 khz section. This is one of the adjustments you make when setting it up.

Installing the antenna is very easy. It uses telescoping sections which are secured by screws. The bottom is comprised of double wall tubing and where it mounts to the mast the antenna is triple wall. This means guys are not necessary. It is 25 feet tall and weighs 25 pounds so it's tough for one person to handle.

So if you think your radio's receiver is performing poorly look to your antenna. Don't rush right out and purchase that big expensive radio. In fact the big radio won't do you any good if your antenna system isn't functioning properly. And if you have limited space and would like to mount something on the ground so you don't have to climb towers, your roof, or trees then think Gap. For the money this is a pretty good antenna.

Some may be already enjoying the hunts. But so many more are unaware and that is where I need your assistance.

(Continued from page 4) <u>FAR ANNOUNCES 2002</u> <u>SCHOLARSHIPS</u>

The Foundation for Amateur Radio, a non-profit organization headquartered in Washington, DC, plans to administer 62 scholarships for the 2002-2003 academic year. FAR-composed of more than 75 local area Amateur Radio Clubs--fully funds seven of these scholarships using the income from grants and its annual hamfest. The remaining 55 are administered by FAR without cost to the donors.

Amateurs Radio licensees may compete for these awards, if they plan to pursue a full-time course of studies beyond high school and are enrolled in or have been accepted for enrollment at an accredited university, college or technical school. The awards range from \$500 to \$2500. Preference in some cases goes to residents of certain geographical areas or to those pursuing certain academic programs. FAR encouraged clubs-especially those in Delaware, Florida, Maryland, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas, Virginia and Wisconsin--to announce and promote these scholarship opportunities.

SOLAR UPDATE

Solar sage Tad Cook, K7VVV, Seattle, Washington, reports: Because of the short work week and ARRL Headquarters schedule (ARRL was closed Thursday and Friday, November 22-23), this update was prepared November 21 and lacks the usual solar flux, sunspot numbers and geomagnetic data.

Jeff Hartley, N8II, in West Virgin ia (FM19) reported the best European 6-meter opening of this solar cycle on November 16. He reports working 117 Europeans from 1340 to 1728 UTC. He said British calls dominated, but he also worked as far east as Poland and Bulgaria. Europeans were working as far west as Ohio, Michigan, Arkansas and Texas.

It has been a quiet week, with no big geomagnetic upsets. The most active

day was Monday, when the planetary A index was 16 and K indices went as high as four. Solar flux and sunspot numbers have been declining.

The latest projection calls for solar flux of 180, 175, 170, 170 and 175 for Wednesday through Sunday, and planetary A indices of 10, 10, 10, 8 and 8 for those same days. Although the forecast is for moderate A indices, there is a chance that sunspot 9704 could emit some Earth-directed explosions.


