

Some of the people have read a book which I have mentioned before: it is a history called "Hello World". It is about ham radio and it is based on a collection of OSL cards. The author had bought them without knowing what they were at a flea market. He wrote the book about the collection and became a ham himself. We have a lot of antenna books here, packet, also some history books including a very neat book from ARRL printed on the 75th anniversary of amateur radio. We have some very good history books about amateur radio including the Lee Droni book which covers the early history of amateur radio "200 Meters Down". I can recommend the first half of this book: the second half of the book is a sleeper, but the first half is very interesting because it goes into how the amateur community was frightened by the US Navy: the US Navy wanted to control all radio. It's a very interesting story. It was written in the 30's or 40's so the writing style is very archaic, but if you can mull through that part it is a very interesting history of early radio. We have all of these neat books in here thanks to the people who have contributed them. There is going to be a little blue card with each book. Put your name and call and date that you sign the book out. Place the card in the pocket inside the box when you take the book out. The books will be upstairs in the club radio room if I am not here. Enjoy the book and then bring it back. If you have any books

TELPAC GATEWAY:

Ron (NY3J):

- On behalf of the Bucks County ARES Group I'd like to thank the Warminster Club for allowing us to put our station in the club room. It is a TELPAC Gateway related to the WINLINK 2000 System which is used primarily for emergency communications and e-mail over RF. It is called a TELPAC Gateway and it interfaces packet with the Internet. If you have a WINLINK type station either portable or setups at a place like BNC over in Ivyland. Using the Internet we can still provide e-mail services through this system for the people of BNC or other service agencies. It is operating pretty good in the upstairs room: it is K3DN-10. Its frequency is 145.670. If you do a Google search on WINLINK 2000 you can read all about how to operate a station like that and how to set it up. Also, you can learn how to join our digital operations in ARES. Thanks again.
- Anthony (KB3DVS): I haven't necessarily tried it, but my father actually uses WINLINK in his Alaska cabin. He lives 47 miles from the tower on the other side of Romanoff. So, for him it is the only link out.

NEW BUSINESS: BOY SCOUT CAMP RADIO




