#### FIELD DAY 2008

Field day 2007 was my first full field day experience. I really enjoyed it and I learned a lot. I took on a lot as a rookie chairperson. But then there were people who stepped in and made sure I didn't screw things up. The band captains made sure each station operated smoothly and I really have to thank Doc Whitticar, W3GAD, for keeping us from starving. This year I need to do my job better and to do that I need to delegate tasks.

Field day is that event that really brings a social radio club together. The WARC mission for field day is to train for emergency situations while having a good time doing it. A respectable point total shows that we achieve our goal. We should not be complacent and say we did good last year let us do things exactly the same. We should try to do a little bit better, a little more. For example; this year we are going to try to network all of the computers together wirelessly. Ron Wenig, NY3J, has volunteered to head that effort.

I am in need of a "buddy". Someone who is willing to help at the chair level, provide a second opinion and be able to step in if needed. It is not going to be a huge investment in time but it is very important that someone volunteer.

The first and primary task delegation is the band captains. Last year we had six stations that were set up and operated in the best tradition of amateur radio. We should increase the number of stations by at least one. Band captains will also serve as a voting committee on various issues. I ask that band captains define their frequency, mode (s) of operation and others needs early so that volunteer operators may be matched to their interests.

The second task to be delegated is food. There is lunch on Saturday, dinner on Saturday, breakfast on Sunday and lunch on Sunday. This function is the most important and time consuming of the weekend. There are many ways to solve this problem; buy food and prepare it there, pre-prepare the food and bring it in, buy food already made and bring it in, have catered food delivered or some combination of the above. We need someone to head this effort. Alone or with a small team, investigate the various possibilities, formulate a solution, submit it to the voting committee for approval and then follow through on field day.

Power generation is the third task. Last year we were not as coordinated as we should have been. We had three gas generators and mathematically we could have used just one. We'd like to use one central generator, radiating the stations out from there and the antennas out from there. This configuration will reduce the consumption of gasoline. Twenty meter expressed their desire to be has independent of this configuration and that's OK. We need someone to head the effort which includes; planning a power budget, getting a suitable generator and a backup, making sure everyone is properly connected and monitoring and supplying gasoline.

The next task is to retrieve the club equipment from the lock up and returning it afterward. This year we should rent a van large enough to take the masts, the large metal box of stakes, tents and the plastic storage bins, but not so large it won't get up the driveway. A team of at least four should be put together (and if possible enlist a couple of high school weight lifters to move that box of stakes).

We need someone to be in charge of soda, water and ice. There is water and some soda left over from last year. Find out what is there and decide what is needed. Ice everything down on Saturday morning. Collect and recycle the used cans. Take leftovers to the Wilson Center to be used for regular meetings.

We need someone to make the late night pizza run.

As I write this article the rules for Field Day 2008 have been posted on the ARRL web site. They are written much more clearly this year. The one change this year is that the demonstration of new modes bonus has been replaced by an educational bonus. A bonus is given for a club that provides a structured educational activity. We will need

someone to volunteer to head this effort.

The Get On The Air (GOTA) transmitter rules are also more clearly written this year. This station may only be operated by an operator who has received his license since Field Day 2007, a generally inactive licensee or a non-licensed person with an appropriate control operator supervising. Points are doubled when a full time coach is assigned to the GOTA station. We will need someone to volunteer to head this effort.

Again I wish to reiterate that Field Day is an important club activity, both to exercise the capability of emergency operation and to socialize with the people who share your interest in the hobby. Please contact me with any ideas you have to improve the club's efforts. Please participate in any way you can. Don't think we have enough people because we never do.
