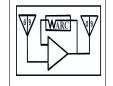

If you are not familiar with the latest news on the ISS, Dr. Simonyi is a billionaire software businessman who paid the Russians a reported \$25M to fly to the space station. During his stay which ended on April 20<sup>th</sup> he made numerous contacts with elementary school students through the ARISS program. He also set aside some time for casual contacts. Much information about his time in space can be found at charlesinspace.com.

I first became aware of his casual operation when I read an ARRL item at http://www.arrl.org/news/ stories/2007/04/11/100/?nc=1. At that point I began following the ISS orbit with my tracking software any time I was at home. Until the evening of April 19<sup>th</sup> I had listened on many passes with no operation occurring. Then suddenly during a pass at 9:15 PM on the 19<sup>th</sup> there he was. Since a pass lasts only about 15 minutes and you are competing with hams all over the US and Canada it makes for an anxious time in an attempt to make the contact. I tried repeatedly with no success until at the very end of the pass, when the ISS footprint was covering just the Northeast US and Southwestern Canada, he heard me and we completed the contact. At the very end of the QSO he was going down below the horizon.

I have tried for several years to work

the shuttle and the ISS without success. I finally did it! I will certainly keep the QSL from this contact in a safe place.

For those of you who think that it takes something exotic to work the ISS I am here to tell you that the simplest of setups will do the job. I only have a 2M vertical at 30 ft and 10W. I even programmed the frequencies in the car in case a pass was made in the daytime.

Another reason to enjoy this hobby!

#### **SOLAR UPDATE**

Solar Fluxmeister Tad "The Spudman" Cook, K7RA, Boise, Idaho, reports: We are on the road in the Gem State this week -- another with few or no sunspots. Most days had zero spots, but from time to time a new sunspot will appear, but only briefly. Expect more of the same conditions, with few or no sunspots. Eventually this year we should reach a point where the only place for solar activity to go is up.

April 20, we may see unsettled geomagnetic activity. Geophysical Institute Prague expects unsettled to active geomagnetic conditions for April 20, unsettled for April 21-22, quiet to unsettled on April 23, and quiet April 24-26. The US Air Force predicts April 28 as the next date for active geomagnetic conditions, with a predicted planetary A index of 25.

Sunspot numbers for April 12 through 18 were 0, 0, 11, 0, 0, 12 and 11, with a mean of 4.9. The 10.7 cm flux was 68.3, 68.3 68.2, 69.3, 69.3, 69.2, and 68.8, with a mean of 68.8. Estimated planetary A indices were 8, 2, 4, 4, 1, 8 and 9, with a mean of 5.1. Estimated mid-latitude A indices were 7, 1, 3, 2, 0, 6 and 6, with a mean of 3.6.

# Swains Island N8S operation tops 100,000 contacts!



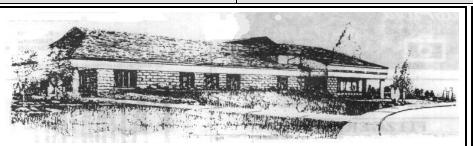
