

President's Message



Get on the Air

As a licensed amateur radio operator for well over 40 years, I have always found ham radio to be a very unique and wide ranging hobby. There are so many activities that are a part of ham radio that just about anyone can find something that sparks his or her interest. But one of the best parts – the one that sets ham radio apart from most other hobbies – is the ability to put a radio signal on the air. Our ham license grants us the privilege of making contact with other hams by way of radio.

Many of us get on the air regularly using 2 meter FM from a handheld or mobile unit. We talk to other hams on one or more of the local repeaters, often during our commute to and from work or on nets. Some of us who have dualband radios also use some of the 440MHZ repeaters as well. This is a great way to take advantage of our privileges as well as meet many of the other hams in our area. But there are other ways to get on the air. How many have you tried?

There are many other bands that we as hams are permitted to use. If you have a Technician class license or higher, you can take advantage of all the VHF and UHF bands. 6 meters is a great band to use both for local and for more distant contacts. Openings on 6 meters can allow you to talk to other hams all over the country and even work some DX with rather small and light-weight antennas. Other bands offer the opportunity to work amateur satellites and the International Space Station.

And the higher frequencies offer challenges in all kinds of "line-of-sight" contacts. You can also operate on 10 meters, which (when the sunspot activity increases) can offer the possibility of making contacts worldwide. And everyone still has CW privileges on 80, 40, and 15 meters.

If you have a General or Extra class license, you can operate on all the other HF bands as well. Bands such as 80 and 40 meters offer the chance to talk to hams both around the country and outside the US. The 20, 17, 15, 12, and 10 meter bands can offer the opportunity to work DX in just about any part of the world. And you don't have to erect a huge tower and have a giant array of antennas to do it. You might be very surprised how many contacts you can make with just a dipole or wire antenna.

Then there are all the different modes of radio operation that you can use. You can talk to other hams using a variety of voice modes. In addition to FM, you can use SSB, digital voice modes, and even good old AM. You can also communicate in CW using Morse code. In fact, you will find a lot of CW activity on many of the bands. By incorporating computer technology with ham radio, various digital modes are available. You can operate in RTTY (radio teletype) without the old, noisy teletype machines. PSK31 and similar modes permit communication by computer text even on noisy and crowded bands using lower power. Then there are SSTV (slow-scan TV), amateur television, and much more.

You don't have to set up a station at home to get on other bands and modes, either. You can put a rig in your car and operate mobile on just about any band. Or you could operate from your car in a stationary position using temporary antennas and your car battery for power. Take along a laptop and you can use the digital modes. You can also set up a portable station in just about any location using temporary wire or vertical antennas and battery power. There are a number of hams who hike or camp and take along radio equipment. You can also participate with clubs and groups who set up stations to operate in contests. We will be operating Field Day in June and more operators are always welcome. You could even obtain the required reciprocal license and operate from another country or participate in a DXpedition. And don't forget, WARC maintains a club station at the Senior Center and you can arrange to operate from there.

Your ham radio license permits you to communicate with other hams via radio, and to do it in many different ways. If you are already active, great! If not, why not get on the air!

Proposed Changes to the WARC Constitution and By-Laws

The board has recommended the following changes be made to the Club's Constitution and By-Laws. As per Article VIII Section 1 of the Constitution, this notice of the proposed changes is being distributed to all club members more than 30 days in advance of any scheduled vote. Discussion of the items listed below will take place at the regular club meetings on May 7, 2009 and June 4, 2009. A vote on these proposals is currently scheduled for the June 4. 2009 meeting. All Regular members in good standing are eligible to vote and are encouraged to attend. A copy of the existing Articles of Incorporation, Constitution and By-Laws are available on the club's web site or upon request.

<u>NOTE:</u> In the proposals below, current language to be deleted is indicated in *italic* and new language to be added is indicated in **bold**.

- 1) By-Laws Section 5 Paragraph 3: The Executive Board shall be empowered to spend no more than \$300.00 five hundred dollars (\$500.00) on any non-budgeted item without bringing it before the Corporation membership for approval.
- 2) Constitution Article II Section 6: Officers, Directors, and members may be removed for cause shown in a motion approved by three-fourths vote of Regular members in good standing. Officers and Directors may be removed from office for cause shown on a motion approved by a majority vote of all Regular Members in good standing. Members may be removed for cause shown on a motion approved by three-fourths vote of all Regular Members in good standing.
- 3) Constitution Article V Section 5: (A new section to be inserted)
 Any motion at a general meeting committing corporation assets shall

not be voted on at that meeting but shall instead be placed on the agenda of the next general meeting unless the motion is determined to be of a time sensitive nature. A proposed motion may be determined to be of a time sensitive nature by a majority vote of the Executive Board members present at that meeting.

- 4) Constitution Article II Section 1: The "Executive Board" of the Corporation shall consist of the Officers as defined in Section 2 of this Article, two elected Directors, two appointed Directors, and *a past President* the Current Club Station Trustee acting in a Director capacity. Any Corporation Officer or Director must be qualified as a Regular Member in good standing for at least six (6) months prior to his/her nomination, and be in good standing in order to exercise his/her duties granted by the Constitution and By-Laws.
- 5) Constitution Article II Section 4:
 One Director shall be the member who last served as President of the Corporation. In the event this individual is unable to assume the Directorship, it will be the responsibility of the Executive Board to appoint a replacement prior to July 1, preferably a previous officer of the Corporation. Deleted

To the Editor:

Our organizing documents require our club to periodically appoint a committee to review those documents, and to recommend to the membership any changes it feels would better serve the club. I have had the honor of chairing such a committee six years ago, and to again serve on a committee this year, chaired by our secretary, Dan Myers, past president Mark Kempisty, and current board member Michael Davis. This committee met in person, and exchanged countless numbers of emails regarding certain changes that were proposed by the Board. In the end, we agreed on most of the changes, and added some of our own. However, we recommended against adopting one of the changes, on which the Board

voted to overrule our committee, and which is Number 4 on the list sent for final approval by the membership. I would like to urge the membership to reject that particular amendment, and to approve the others.

I urge you to vote AGAINST the proposed amendment to Article II Section 1 of the Constitution to eliminate the position of Past President, and to replace it with the position of Club Station Trustee. The idea is to have an experienced member serve on the Board. My concern is that the Trustee might, after a period of time, lose interest in attending Board meetings and otherwise serving as a Board member. That, I understand, is the reason for proposing the change in the first place: many past presidents have suffered burnout and do not give the position of past president the meaning it deserves. However, the past president only serves for a limited period of time, and is eventually replaced by the next past president. In addition, if the past president is unable to serve as a board member, s/he can decline the position, which allows the Board to appoint a replacement.

The Trustee of an amateur radio club is usually a long-standing member who is likely to remain such for a long time - that's the reason why that person has his/her only official duty of holding the FCC club license. Otherwise, the club would have to keep applying for new licenses every time the trustee changed. Our current Trustee, George Brechmann, is already on the Board by virtue of having been elected to it (Both the March and April 2009 issues of Feedback erroneously list him as the "Past President"). I firmly hope and believe that George will continue to serve on the Board as an elected board member as long as he wishes, and the club membership will agree, but if that situation ever changes, the membership should be able to choose someone else. And that brings up my last reason for opposing the proposed change: our documents don't make any mention of the Trustee - as far as they're concerned, s/he doesn't exist. Our club station, the license, and Trustee, exist only unofficially as an important club activity.

There are no provisions for choosing or removing the Trustee, and if the proposed amendment gets approved, the position will go into a state of uncertainty - it would mention the Trustee, but there would be absolutely no other mention of who that person is, how that person gets appointed, whether that person even needs to be a club member, and in effect doesn't legally exist! This is why a special committee is appointed to review the documents in the first place - to make sure that the issues get thoroughly discussed and thought through, so there won't be any broken links or other miscues. If the Board chooses to ignore its committee's recommendations, anything can happen as the Board doesn't really have the time to devote to the whole documents like the committee did. And, I believe the amendment won't even accomplish what the Board wanted to accomplish in the first place, which is to be more certain of getting an experienced member who will serve on the Board.

Please vote NO on proposed amendment 4 to the Constitution Article II Section 1. and YES on proposed amendments 1, 2, 3, and 5.

Jack Brown, W3SHY SK

Jim, KB3NNB, reports that Jack Brown, W3SHY, of Washington Crossing recently became a silent key. Jack, born in 1922, had a long career in electronics and was first licensed as a ham in 1938. I mentioned him in my talk on antennas at the National Radio Astronomy Observatory, Greenbank, because he had worked at NBS in Virginia with Grote Reber, the amateur to first publish a chart of radio sky "noise" and whose callsign was used in the movie "Contact". Jack also was the Chief Engineer(and at some point President) of Barker and Williamson in Bristol and designer of several pieces of their Ham equipment. I mentioned Jack again in my talk on frequency measurement and played a video interview of him that appeared on a local PBS station. His link with frequency measurement was his then current business from his home of providing accurate frequency validation services to about 100 local FM stations. The video of him showed the part of his interview where he related receiving and relaying the CW Japanese request for surrender negotiations after the first A-Bomb had been dropped to MacArthur's headquarters in the Philippines where it had gone unheard Jack is survived by three sons. A memorial service will be held Monday, May 4, 7:30 p.m. in the Sanctuary, Langhorne Presbyterian Church, 123 Gillam Ave, Langhorne, quite .-- ...-- -.-- ... -.-




