

### President's Message



Well, summer is officially over and the first day of autumn has past. The great thing about this part of the country is that the seasons tend to favor great weather (compared to other regions where it has already snowed.) And while it should be awhile before we see snow here in Southeast PA, it is never too early to "be prepared" for the worst of things.

Hugh N3SOQ and I worked the MS150 City to Shore Bike Tour on the weekend of September 18th, along with about 50 other hams. In a lot of respects the event challenged ham radio operators to be prepared. Many came with "jump kits" because they had to set up in cars, buses and ambulances, which they knew nothing about in advance. The assignment was given at 5:30AM on Saturday morning, and most of us had about 15 to 20 minutes to set up our radios, antennas and other accessories so that the crews could begin on time. It was like a minipreparedness exercise, and the challenge was to get operating on a net that supported the medical and logistical needs of the event. For the next two days we had to keep our stations operational and on the air for the entire length of the South Jersey event. Frequencies changed as did PL tones over the course of 75 miles. So I had an opportunity to "use" my radio meaning that I had to set and reset things as the distance from the starting line changed. My radio is an Alinco 605T that has cross-band repeat capabilities. So I used that feature with an HT whenever my ambulance crew stepped out of the vehicle to patrol the crowds of people which congregated at

the rest/food stops along the route. That feature is easy to use, if you practice using it. I roomed on Saturday night with a fellow ham, Skip N2EI, who rode the entire event (both ways) on a bicycle. He carried an HT with an antenna mounted on his bicycle and supported the event by being a "spotter" reporting any problems, injuries, etc. as he observed them. While the amount of gear that he carried was minimal, it was extremely important in his case that it was at the peak of "readiness." So again the

# WARC at the Grange Fair 2004

Again this year WARC sponsored a special event site at the annual Grange Fair in Wrightstown. Setup was on the Tuesday before the fair and operation was daily from Wednesday through Sunday. We operated mainly on 20 meters using the club TS-140 and a manually switchable 80-15 meter inverted vee. We made 300 contacts beating last years 200 with many DX contacts. I did not count but we probably worked half the US states and about 10 foreign countries. Unlike last year 20 meters was opened all day into the evenings. The special event was the 90th anniversary of the ARRL and the 50th anniversary of the Agricultural Research Service. I designed the certificate and Tony made the final copies. The event was listed in the August QST and to date we have received over 50 SASE.s sent in for certificates.

The event went well. It was hot as usual. The only glitch was a quick but strong thunderstorm on Saturday

which almost took our tent down. Fortunately we had good warning and had disconnected everything and moved to our cars. We were back in operation within an hour.

We had an emergency contact on Friday evening while I was operating, and Burt, N3YVH was logging. I took an emergency call from a mobile station in Arizona. He had run out of gas and his cell phone was not working and he was in a very desolate area. Since he was an AAA member, I contacted them and they dispatched service to him. We kept in contact with him as long as we could but we were not able to confirm that help arrived. Let.s hope it did!

On Sunday we had a surprise visit. A woman with a young child stopped by the booth and announced she was a distant niece of Samuel F. B. Morse, the inventor of Morse Code. We took pictures with her son, Warner Alden Morse, tapping the key. He did it spontaneously! At the same time and in the same picture was Les Hummel whose father was a telegrapher on the Delaware and Lackawanna Railroad. Bill, K3ZMA, is sending the picture along with write-up to the ARRL.
