# Next Meeting October 4th, 2012 – ARRL Night

# **President's Message**

September has turned out to be a great month for Dx'ing. I hope everyone had an opportunity to work, or at least listen to, the NH8S station on Swains Island. Swains Island is an atoll in the Tokelau chain. Culturally a part of Tokelau, it is an unincorporated unorganized territory of the United States administered by American Samoa. History tells (and some trivia) us that the Island was first visited by a Portuguese explorer named Pedro Fernandes de Queirós. He is believed to have been the first European explorer to have visited Swains Island, arriving on 2 March 1606. In 1841 the Island was re-named after W.C Swains, a whaling captain by captain William L. Hudson of the American ship *Peacock* who visited the atoll in 1841 and found that the island was not at the position reported by de Queirós, Hudson concluded that the whaling captain W.C. Swains who had alerted them to the island had discovered it, and he renamed it Swains Island. This was one of the top wanted DXCC operations. I was able to work them on both 20 and 15 meters (both SSB and CW). With excellent band conditions, they were very loud into North America on both 20M and 15M starting around 10:00pm. Bill Balentine, K3FMQ, reported that early in the morning was a good time to work them on 40M. I am not sure what the final count was, but last I heard it was over 50,000 contacts in the log. Look for **Conway Reef**, another rare DXCC country on the air around 26 September.

In October we find a number of state QSO parties that includes the Pennsylvania QSO Party on 13<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup>. Information can be found at http://www.nittany-arc.net/paqsorules.html. We also find the CQWW SSB contest on 0000Z, Oct 27 to 2400Z, Oct 28, 2012. This is a good SSB contest to work a number of DX stations and good way to earn your first DXCC award with only 100 confirmed QSO's. The rules can be found at http://www.cqww.com/rules.php. Note that a new rule now requires all CQWW contest logs to be submitted within 5 days.

On September 15<sup>th</sup>, 8 club members, one spouse and my grandchild joined us for an excellent tour of the Battleship New Jersey. Not only did we get a very extensive tour, but also had an opportunity to work the NJ2BB station.

Two club Public Service activities in October include Warminster Golf outing on October 8<sup>th</sup>, Craven Hall 5K run on October 20<sup>th</sup>. # SOLAR UPDATE

Tad "We all shine on, like the Moon and the stars and the Sun <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=EqP3wT5lpa4>" Cook, K7RA, reports: The average daily sunspot numbers rose this week from 56 to 81.3, while the average daily solar flux increased from 101.4 to 129.7. This increase is expected to continue over the next few days, with the solar flux peaking at 150 on September 28-29, then going to 145 on September 30-October 1, 140 and 135 on October 2-3, 130 on October 4-5, 125 on October 6-7, 120 on October 8, 115 on October 9-10, 120 on October 11, 115 on October 12-13, and 120 on October 14-15. It is then expected to rise to a peak of 150 on October 20 and 150 again on October 25-26, with the average solar flux on October 21-24 around 141. The average planetary A index declined from 7.4 last week to 4.3 this week. The predicted planetary A index values are 5 on every day through October 2, then 10 on October 3, 8 on October 4-5, and 5 on October 6-11. Look for more on the ARRL website on Friday, September 28. # Sean Smith, KG4WSS, Killed in Consulate Attack

Sean P. Smith, KG4WSS, of Falls Church, Virginia, was killed when the US Consulate in Benghazi, Libya, was attacked on September 11. He was 34. Smith was one of four Americans, including Chris Stevens -- the US Ambassador to Libya -- who was killed in the attack.

Smith -- a native of San Diego -- enlisted in the Air Force in 1995 at age 17. He served six years as a ground radio maintenance specialist, including a deployment to Oman, before leaving the service in 2002 as a staff sergeant. He was awarded the Air Force Commendation Medal. Smith, who had worked at the State Department for 10 years, was in Libya on a temporary assignment when he was killed; Before his temporary assignment to Benghazi, Smith served for the State Department in Brussels, Baghdad, Pretoria, Montreal and The Hague.

"Sean was a friend of mine, and while he was not a very active operator he was an extremely skilled electronic technician," James Kirkham, W4HFK, told the ARRL. "He was instrumental in getting me back into the hobby after a 10 year hiatus."

Smith was well known in the online gaming community as an avid participant of the space fantasy game *EVE Online*, where he was known as "Vile Rat," one of the leaders of a gamers' alliance and renowned for his diplomatic skill in the multi-player space warfare simulation.

"If you play this stupid game, you may not realize it, but you play in a galaxy created in large part by Vile Rat's talent as a diplomat," said Smith's friend Alex Gianturco, in a tribute posted on his **website**. No one focused as relentlessly on using diplomacy as a strategic tool as VR." Gianturco wrote that Smith had been under fire before, when he was posted to Baghdad. When that occurred, he usually broke off his messaging. "We'd freak out and he'd come back okay after a bit," Gianturco wrote. "But Tuesday night, after reporting 'GUNFIRE,' he disconnected and never returned." A few hours earlier that evening, Smith posted the following: "assuming we don't die tonight. We saw one of our 'police' that guard the compound taking pictures."

Smith is survived by his wife, Heather, and two young children, Samantha and Nathan. "They will grow up being proud of the service their father gave to our country, service that took him from Pretoria to Baghdad, and finally to Benghazi," Secretary of State Hillary Rodham Clinton said in a statement. – *Thanks to* **The Washington Post**, *CNN*, the US Air Force, Bill Cross, W3TN, and James Kirkham, W4HFK, for the information

# **Looking Ahead to WRC-15**

WRC-15 Agenda Item 1.4 calls on the delegates "to consider possible new allocation to the Amateur Service on a secondary basis with the band 5250-5450 kHz in accordance with Resolution 649 (WRC-12)." According to Stafford, the IARU will be spending a lot of time and effort to garner support and to ensure the passage of this Agenda Item.

**Agenda Item 1.1** is "to consider additional spectrum allocations to the mobile service on a primary basis and identification of additional frequency bands for International Mobile Telecommunications (IMT) and related regulatory provisions, to facilitate the development of terrestrial mobile broadband applications, in accordance with Resolution 233 (WRC-12)."

Other WRC-15 Agenda Items the IARU will be closely monitoring include the following:

Agenda Item 1.6.1: "To consider possible additional primary allocations to the fixed satellite service (Earth-to-space and space-to-Earth) of 250 MHz in the range between 10 GHz and 17 GHz in Region 1."

*Agenda Item 1.10*: "To consider spectrum requirements and possible additional spectrum allocations for the mobile-satellite service in the Earth-tospace and space-to-Earth directions, including the satellite component for broadband applications, including International Mobile Telecommunications (IMT), within the frequency range from 22 GHz to 26 GHz, in accordance with Resolution 234 (WRC-12)."

*Agenda Item 1.18*: "To consider a primary allocation to the radiolocation service for automotive applications in the 77.5-78.0 GHz frequency band in accordance with Resolution 654 (WRC-12)."

"A lot of radio amateurs are aware of the increasing use of amateur spectrum by small satellites, mainly by universities," Stafford noted. "It is becoming an increasingly difficult situation to accommodate the number of small, non-commercial satellites within the amateur bands. These education-based satellites do not really fit within the definition of the Amateur Radio Service, but have been accommodated there. These small satellites are categorized as nanosatellites (weighing between 1-10 kg) and picosatellites (weighing less than 1 kg). The ITU is trying to deal with this issue in an orderly manner and a 'preliminary' WRC-18 agenda item is to consider whether these satellite operations can be accommodated in an already crowded radio spectrum. As these issues develop, the IARU will keep its Member-Societies, such as the ARRL, aware of developments."




