**To our Pennsylvania Members:**

We need your help in urging your radio club to send a letter of support for the new federal HOA bill to our PA Senators. Some of the big PAClubs have responded promptly using our suggested letter. A proposed form letter to be placed on the club letterhead has been circulated by our Western and Eastern PA section managers a few weeks ago. Contact them if you need a copy for your club officers. Many clubs have not yet responded and we urge them to do so ASAP.

As you may know, ARRL has been advancing our new HOA bill introduced in 2024. It is now pending in the relevant committees in the US House and Senate. Our Senator John Fetterman is on a key committee, and we need to solicit his support as a sponsor and supporter of our bill to get it out of committee. It is also useful to get the attention of our other Senator Dave McCormick for support, so get a separate letter to delivery McCor mick as well. Keep in mind that we need radio clubs to write in, not individual hams yet. That is next. And the club letter we have already drafted for you should not be sent directly to the Senators for good reason. Here is the plan:

My colleague John Robert Stratton, Esq., of Texas, N5AUS, the West Gulf Director of the ARRL leads our legislative effort in DC. He knows his way around such efforts. We recommend the general form we have sent out be closely followed.

We have retained a top-notch lobby firm in DC guiding our efforts this time around. We need signed letters delivered to us for hand delivery to the Senator's offices by our DC Lobby Firm. **DO NOT SEND THESE LETTERS DIRECTLY.** They may not be seen for months and will typically be overlooked. Rather, we have a commitment from our DC firm to hand deliver the letters to the Senator(s) office in DC.

As a separate project, we are constructing a website for individual hams later to directly support the bill with automatic generation of letters for hams to write to their legislators if the bill gets out of committee, but this club strategy is very important first so we get the bill advanced.

If your club has not done so yet, please complete the letter and send it by Scanned PDF directly to Director Stratton below. Please copy me, your Atlantic Division Director, Bob Famiglio, K3RF and send a copy to your section manager as well. I am a board advocate for this project. We would like to get these letters back and ready for delivery before the Senate returns from their summer break soon if possible. We need your help to get our HOA bill through.

## **New ARRL® DXCC® Trident Award Plaque Honors 100 Confirmed Entities on Three Modes**

ARRL announces the DXCC® Trident Plaque, a new program to honor the accomplishments of radio amateurs who have confirmed QSOs with at least 100 ARRL DXCC award entities on each of three modes (phone, CW, and digital).

The basic award is issued upon application and confirmation by the ARRL Awards Department, and it is endorsable at levels of 200, 300, and Honor Roll, based on achieving that level on all three modes at the time of application.

The earliest QSO date, and starting date for the DXCC Trident Award, is November 1, 1976, when RTTY (now named digital) DXCC was introduced.

ARRL Radiosport and Regulatory Affairs Manager Bart Jahnke, W9JJ, says the new award should be exciting to hams. “It gives all participants of the DXCC program, especially those new to DXCC, something fresh to work towards,” he said. ARRL has long had the Worked All States Triple Play award, but this introduces the multi-mode achievement to the DXCC program.

Confirmation of QSOs toward the Trident is done only through the standard process by credits within the ARRL DXCC program via Logbook of The World® (LoTW®). No QSL cards will be accepted with a plaque application. If your DXCC credits are not already visible in LoTW, you must first link your DXCC and LoTW profiles by requesting a credit merge from the ARRL Awards Desk.

## **Amateur Radio at Minnesota’s Tour of Saints Bike Event**

In Central Minnesota near St. Cloud, there has been an organized bike event in the area for at least 50 years, supported by amateur radio for much of that time. The event has recently had in the range of 500-1000 riders, and has three routes/courses of 18, 35 and 50 miles. Local businesses, including an orchard and bakery, support the rest stops. Summer weekends in Minnesota are busy, and the local St. Cloud Radio Club, WØSV, was hinting it was short of operators, and particularly SAG (Supplies, Athletes and Gear) drivers. I have never actually driven a SAG, and it seemed a chance to learn a new skill and return the favor to many out-of-state clubs and hams who drive in to support our big urban marathons.

One of the strengths of amateur radio at events is our ability to organize directed nets. These can solve many problems and predate the Incident Command System, but are the same underlying idea. Somebody takes over as Net Control and it does not matter who they are or where they are from. This system again worked perfectly here.

In the weeks before the event, Chris Schultz, KCØYFX, was helping to organize volunteers. We work together on nine days of annual MS Society bike events, and he knew it all. The ICS-205 revealed we had good radio coverage (two VHF repeaters and a simplex channel) and reportedly we would be driving rented large crew cab pickup trucks. (For the MS events, we prefer passenger vans with trailers for bikes. These are becoming rare, though, as trailer towing with rented vehicles is not always allowed).

Schultz is also an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT). Events in Minnesota (such as in the City of St. Paul) are often required to have formal medical, crisis and weather plans. Bits of first aid training can be helpful in the operations/safety role that we often have. Shortages of medical volunteers are ongoing. The idea is the event provides basic support and you call 911 for more serious problems.

I packed my first aid bag; several were provided by the club. I grabbed a pair of waterproof Baofeng handheld radios, speaker mics and a magnet mount antenna. These radios have impressive battery life and USB-C charging capability and cost \$20 if lost. The idea was that setup would take a mere five minutes.

The night before the event, we were asked to bring coolers for ice and water and were informed there was no 12V lighter socket in the newer GMC trucks. Instead, there is a 115V AC outlet and USB A and C sockets in the center console.

One helpful hint regarding SAG operations: use street addresses. The 911 system uses these as well. I conducted beacon-to-APRS® using APRSDroid and the Internet/TCP function.

Chris and I were assigned to the Cold Spring rest stop, which was hard to get to due to road construction and we had to drive the course a bit. Riders tended to ride abreast and we spent a lot of time in the oncoming traffic lane which was nerve-wracking.

Our rest stop had a donut truck, and the local ham and bike mechanic had a canopy but no spare chairs. We had perfect weather and luck. There were few, if any, injuries or wrecks. As this stop closed down, we were asked to retrace the route, look for/assist stragglers, and pick up the signs. The Baofeng radio was disappointing: the squelch was hard, even set at 1. I prefer a softer squelch that lets you catch more of the radio traffic in weak signal areas. But old radios are unhappy without a supply of 12V.

#### Lessons Learned

1. Radio-on-a-chip equipment is a “no” after this event.
2. Magnetic-mount antennas are fine and quick to set up. Bring a 5/8 wave whip over a quarter wave antenna.
3. Races and events are using the Ride with GPS app/website more. But it was complicated to use.
4. Driving is a full-time role, so a navigator in the right seat is still a critical requirement.
5. Bring lunch for a seven-hour shift, along with a box of medical gloves.
6. I like street addresses, numbered mile markers, and named rest stops. The common natural conflict between numbered rest stops and mile markers (rest stop one at mile five) is not a best practice.
7. The event used wrist bands versus numbered bibs. It was difficult to tell easily from a distance who was a participant versus a random rider out for a ride; to ensure the correct person was picked up; and for logging.
8. Magnetic signs and flashing yellow lights are a good reminder to motorists there is a bike race underway. --Erik Westgard, NY9D, ARRL Assistant Section Emergency Coordinator for Events, Minnesota Section

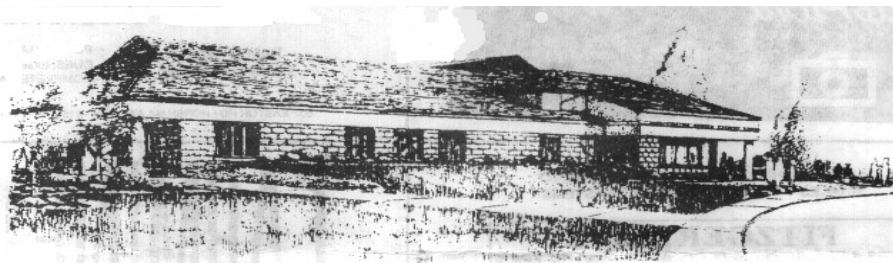

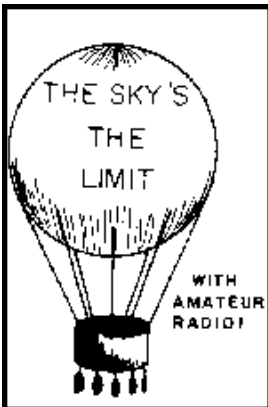
